### MISSION STATEMENT //

#### **Mission**

Emotion emanates from the sounds of our world. 'The Tension of Opposites' is an orchestral exploration of life in an effort to increase awareness of the more pertinent issues challenging our society.

#### **Vision**

The Tension of Opposites is a large-scale contemporary work written for symphony orchestra, mixed chorus, tape and soloists. It is a work that deals with humanity, diversity, and the major life issues we all face as human beings on this earth. The concept of *The Tension of Opposites* was first introduced by the philosopher Carl Jung, who wrote about the reality of the many forces pulling human beings in opposite directions during their lifetime.

By exposing the emotional content of life, *The Tension of Opposites* explores the similarities and differences between the opposite events that we experience as human beings. For instance, is the sound of laughing and crying closer than we think; is the sound of pleasure and pain closer or more divergent than we expect? What about the moments when life begins and ends?

## 02. ORCHESTRAL JOURNALISM //

#### Eclecticism (-'klek-t&-"siz-&m) noun

**01:** a theory or practice that combines doctrines or methods from diverse sources. Matthew Ferraro pioneers this technique in his work, *The Tension of Opposites*.

For the last six years, Matthew Ferraro has traveled to various places around the world, documenting, with the first-hand precision of a journalist, people's actual life experiences. From living with the homeless in Los Angeles to covering Ground Zero in New York City, from birthing centers to intensive care units, mosques to synagogues, Matthew Ferraro has recorded the sonic nature of these environments. He returns to his studio after each field recording, and weaves the material into musical compositions that are orchestrated into symphonic movements.

In 2002, after listening to some of the compositions, the Director and Deputy Director of the California Arts Council found this form of expression to be an "artistic breakthrough" and "a new art form." They named it "Orchestral Journalism."

## Ø3. MOVEMENTS //

#### Fanfare for the Common Machine • Man vs Nature

Can Industry and Nature co-exist? Composed as an allegory to Aaron Copeland's Fanfare for the Common Man, this movement addresses the ongoing struggle between man and nature, exploring the dissonance and synergy between these two formidable forces. This movement combines an expansive palette of sounds, arranged with the orchestra, to create a complex sonic environment that demonstrates the powerful juxtaposition of industry and nature.

#### **Beliefs** • Faith vs Fundament

Can all religions co-exist in the same environment? This movement is a mosaic of prayers, ceremonies and sacred rituals from more than 30 of the world's major religions. The integration of these sounds provides a metaphor for our increasingly global society and inspires us to find the commonalities between all cultures and religions.

#### TITLE TBA • Life vs Death

Is there a message to be found from the tragedy of 9/11? This movement examines how the human spirit deals with tragedy. It chronicles the day through the eyes of various individuals and their emotional testimonials. Their thoughts and observations show us how the human spirit responds to horrific circumstances.

#### TITLE TBA • Wealth vs Poverty

There are millions of people worldwide living below the poverty threshold. Over 3 million are children in the United States alone. This movement uses sounds documented from living in homeless shelters, skid rows, and city ghettos to address the issues of disparate economic groups across the world.

### ②4. SUPPORT & ENDORSEMENTS //

The groundbreaking nature and artistic complexity of using the actual sounds of life experiences as a musical tool for a major symphonic work has generated tremendous support.

Americans for the Arts has posted information about *The Tension of Opposites* on its website and provided a letter of endorsement. The Ahmanson Foundation has provided valuable leads to aid the project.

**Distinguished M.I.T. Professor Joe Davis** has donated the sound of single celled organisms recorded with a laser beam under a microscope to be included in one of the symphonic movements.

The City of New York and the New York City Fire Department provided advice and information regarding Matthew Ferraro's recording at Ground Zero. Members of the NYFD also provided personal testimonials of their experiences on September 11, 2001.

**My Friends' Place** and **The Los Angeles Mission** facilitated Matthew Ferraro's recordings of the plight of homeless youth and adults.

**St. John's Hospital** in Los Angeles and **Santa Monica Hospital** granted Matthew Ferraro access to record some of the most intimate moments of human birth and death.

**Plains Exploration & Production Co.** sponsored a field recording trip to their oil rigs and donated supplies. They have also provided corporate funds to the project.
